

Bonnie Jean (Regan) Rowe

Bonnie Jean (Regan) Rowe, daughter of Walter Lee and Ruth Bell (Bridges) Ragan, was born March 5, 1930, in Cameron, Oklahoma. She passed away from this world on February 1, 2024 in Ranger, Texas at the age of 93 years, 333 days. She was convalescing at her oldest son Tom's house at the time of her death. Prior to this, she had been cared for by her youngest son, Kimmy Joe, at her home in Ravia, Oklahoma for several years due to gradual declining mental and physical health.

She married Walter "A.D." Rowe in Watsonville, California on May 23, 1947. They moved across the country many times following other relatives from Oklahoma, Arkansas, Texas and California, as A.D. and his brothers (known as the Seven Rowe Brothers Band) pursued their artistic endeavors in the Western Swing musical genre.

Before deciding to move to Ravia, OK due to declining health of her husband A.D. who was suffering from Alzheimer's Disease, they had lived in Irving, Texas for 20+ years. She worked as a waitress at Jan's Coffee Shop for many years before becoming full-time dispatch operator for A.D.'s thriving locksmith business, which was known as AAB Line Locksmith. The "AAB" in the company name stood for "A.D, And Bonnie." Between the two of them, there wasn't much they couldn't accomplish.

Bonnie was preceded in death by her parents, her husband (A.D. Rowe), and her infant daughter- Ruby Jean Rowe,

She is survived by two sons – Tommy Dale Rowe of Ranger, Texas and Kimmy Joe Rowe, Ravia, OK; a sister Bobbie Jo Mazon of Ravia, OK, A sister-in-law, Louise Rowe Beasley of Euless, TX, scores of nieces and nephews, 8 grandchildren and numerous great- as well as great-great-grandchildren.
